Members of the Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT)

Are specialists in the care and management of patients with a Malignancy of Unknown Origin (MUO). Patients with MUO are discussed at the MDT meeting and the members will agree an individual management plan for each patient.

This may include additional tests. For example: CT scan, MRI scan, Blood tests.

Following the MDT meeting you will be seen in clinic, on the ward or receive a telephone call by the consultant. Your management plan will be discussed with you and your family. You will be offered a summary of these discussions if you would like one.

All MUO patients are offered a Key Worker (this is often a Clinical Nurse Specialist or CNS), in addition, you will have contact with our MUO Pathway Navigator. These health care professionals will be responsible for supporting you and coordinating your care.

The MDT includes members from York and Scarborough Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust.

The Core members are:

Consultant Oncologist

A doctor who diagnoses and treats cancer patients

Consultant Radiologist

A doctor who interprets x-rays, CT & MRI scans. May perform biopsies too

Consultant Histopathologist

A doctor who interprets tissue samples (biopsies)

Consultant in Palliative Care

A doctor who provides palliative care and symptomatic support such as pain management

MUO Clinical Nurse Specialist

A senior nurse who provides information, support, and advice

MUO MDT Co-Ordinator

The MDT team administrator

MUO Pathway Navigator

A person who provides; clerical administration, patient support and produces reports on MDT discussions.
