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The Local Skin Multi-Disciplinary Team

The Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) are a group of health professionals from different professional backgrounds. They have expertise in all areas of skin cancer management from diagnosis through to treatment and ongoing follow-up.

The skin cancer Multi-Disciplinary Team consists of consultant dermatologists, pathologists, oculoplastic and plastic surgeons alongside a dermatology registrar, clinical nurse specialists and cancer pathway coordinators.

The team meets fortnightly to discuss all patients who have been diagnosed with melanoma, squamous cell carcinoma and other skin cancers. The purpose of this meeting is to agree the most appropriate treatment plan for you. If the clinical team are to discuss your skin cancer care you will be informed.

Treatment options

You will be seen as an outpatient in clinic. These are held at York, Scarborough, Malton and Selby hospitals.

When you attend your outpatient appointment, there is the facility to perform skin biopsies which is sample of tissue removed for examination under a microscope for the purpose of diagnosis. Sometimes we perform complete excisions; this is a complete surgical removal of a suspected skin cancer lesion. These can be performed by a trained nurse or a doctor. Sometimes we will make an appointment for you to come back for a biopsy on another day.

When a diagnostic biopsy confirms a skin cancer, the doctor may recommend further surgery and possibly referral to a specialist surgeon.

The role of the Macmillan Clinical Nurse Specialist

A Macmillan Clinical Nurse Specialist (CNS) is a registered nurse who has additional specialist knowledge and experience in a specific area.

The skin cancer Macmillan Clinical Nurse Specialists are based at York hospital. They are available to speak to any patients diagnosed with skin cancer, and provide written information, psychological support and answer any questions you may have. You may hear them referred to as your 'Key Worker'. This is someone who, with your agreement, takes a key role in coordinating your care and promoting continuity.

Spiritual care

The spiritual care teams based at York and Scarborough serve patients, their families and hospital staff members in their times of need. These caring individuals offer expertise in several faith traditions and all share an absolute respect for your personal beliefs and offer non-judgmental, quiet, listening presence.
