What is a FibroScan?

Examination with FibroScan, also called transient elastography, is a technique used to assess liver stiffness without invasive investigation. The result shows the condition of the liver and allows physicians to diagnose and monitor disease evolution in conjunction with treatment and other factors. Exam results help to anticipate various complications, as well as to monitor and assess the damage caused by conditions such as cirrhosis.

Can I eat before the FibroScan examination?

No. Please do not eat any food and only drink clear liquids for three hours before your scan.

Is it painful?

No. The FibroScan examination is painless, quick and easy. During measurement, you might feel a slight vibration on the skin at the tip of the probe.

What does the FibroScan examination consist of?

The operator applies a water-based gel to the skin and places the probe with a slight pressure.

What does the result mean?

Your doctor interprets the result according to your history and underlying disease and will discuss this with you at your next appointment.

Who can prescribe the FibroScan examination?

Your consultant or hepatologist will indicate the most appropriate time for you to have the examination.

What difference does FibroScan make for me?

- The exam is easy, fast, painless and non-invasive.
- In case of close follow-up, the examination can be safely repeated.

In Brief:

The result obtained with FibroScan will allow your doctor or consultant to monitor your liver health over time with or without treatment.

The FibroScan examination shall not be used:

- On any other organ than the liver
- On wounds
- On patients with ascites
